BACKGROUND: Following CAPT Lloyd's testimony at the hearing, above staff cornered Mr. Helton (NOAA Witness) and CAPT Lloyd (CG Witness) and began asking questions about current flow-rate projections. Both NOAA & CG maintained that info was promulgated from and with transparency through FRTT, however staff appeared to imply that there are other independent or other contracted flow-rate estimates than what have been currently published - and these are not being made public or sufficiently transparent.
